Our average worship attendance has decreased four years in a row: 2008/**249**, 2009/**246**, 2010/**221**, 2011/**209**. It will take everyone's prayer, energy, wisdom and outreach to reverse this downward trend. During worship on January 15 most worshippers came forward to light a candle symbolizing their light in the world (see Abby Taylor's drawing in this Call). As one of God's "lights" in our church, how will you help Fairmont grow? Our Session is confronting our declining membership and attendance and would love to hear your ideas on how we can grow Fairmont. Again, it will take a united effort to begin growing our church!

While 2012 is shaping up to be positive for me, I am, however, facing a personal challenge. On January 25 I will be having colon resection surgery to remove a non-cancerous polyp. As I am writing this article before that surgery, allow me to thank you in advance for your prayers and support for Connie and me. My gratitude is extended to Denise for covering many of my responsibilities while I recover and for you as you step forward to fulfill Fairmont's ministry. I will be out of the pulpit through February but will slowly be reengaging in visitation, Lenten Study Group and administration as my recovering health allows. I am so grateful for your care and concern. May God bless us all!

**Reuse, Reduce, Recycle!**  
**Here’s what you can put in the Recycling Bin at Fairmont:**

**Newspaper and Inserts** – New newsprint can be made from 100% recycled paper. No virgin fiber has to be added when using this type of process.

**Magazines/catalogs** – Our Retriever program is happy to take magazines and catalogs, all slick paper. We can use all this high quality/high fiber paper with the exception of any paper coated in wax.

**Office/School papers** – These types of paper are highly recyclable. Because of the proliferation of paper created by offices and schools, please use the Retriever bin to recycle all that you can. We are able to accept window envelopes, paperback books, workbooks and staples without a problem. Shredded paper is acceptable, but please bag the shreds before putting them in the Retriever bin.



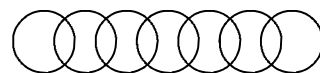
However, please do NOT recycle colored paper, wrapping or tissue paper, carbon paper or sticky notes.

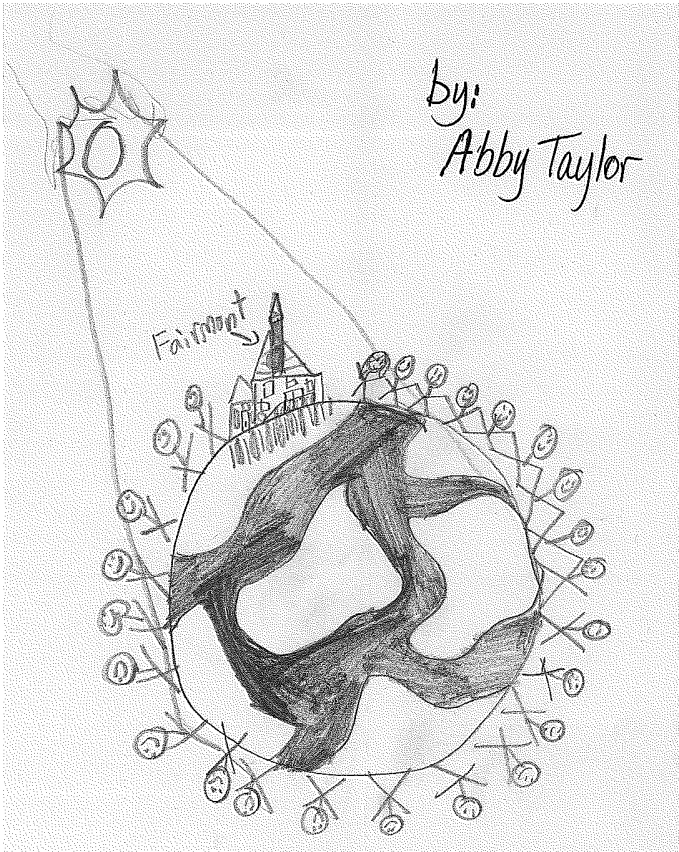
**LENTEN STUDY 2012**
