The gentle wind of transformation is blowing through our church and I am excited about what is happening. As you know we added two part time staff members in August and they are having quite a wonderful impact on the youth and children's ministries within their first month.

*Ashley Ross*, our 20-hour a week Youth Ministry Coordinator, proposed to Session and received their green light to create a *Youth Coffee House* across from the CE office. This Coffee House will be open to our youth on Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:25 as a place to hang out. Ashley will be there to laugh, talk and become better acquainted with our young people. Within Ashley's first month of employment, our youth and their parents have experienced Ashley to be fun, witty, full of energy and one who has a great vision for Youth ministry....including a Sunday morning coffee house! Thank you for praying for our youth, Youth Ministry and Ashley!

*Lisa Shearer*, our 20-hour a week Interim Children's Ministry Coordinator, proposed to Session and received their green light to move the Toddler Room to the Nursery and the Nursery to the Art Room. This move will bring the toddlers to the same wing as the rest of the Sunday School classes making it safer for our children and more convenient for their parents. It will give the toddlers a bathroom in their own room so the teachers will not have to leave the room to take a child to the bathroom. The Art Room will make a convenient Nursery in the same hallway as all Sunday School rooms and also will provide a sink which will be helpful for clean up. Within Lisa's first month of employment, our church, which has experienced Lisa's graciousness with children for several years, is learning that Lisa also has a wonderful vision for Children's ministry....including more convenient and better equipped Toddler Room and Nursery. Thank you for praying for our children, Children's Ministry and Lisa!

Session also approved hiring *Bill Miller, III* in a brand new position called *Information Specialist!* As you will soon experience, Bill has a wonderful gift-mix of computer, sound, software programming and is willing to tackle those technical issues that cause most of us to throw up our hands in frustration!

Yes, we have employed three part time people in the last month causing some to wonder if this places a strain upon our personnel budget. The Session is fully aware of the budget constraints facing Fairmont and remains committed to a balanced budget. Our Session also recognizes our staffing needs and is committed to paying staff fairly. You will recall that last year Session approved a salary freeze and took steps to reduce hours and staff positions to balance the budget. It was very painful but necessary. I think you will be pleasantly surprised by the following comparison of Personnel Budgets:

2008:	\$406,086	2009:	\$410,894
2010:	\$385,691	2011:	\$348,652 (year of staff reductions)
2012:	\$355,406 to \$361,139 (total is yet to be decided...I have requested no salary increase for myself and new hires will not be receiving an increase)		

A new wind is blowing at Fairmont and I believe it is the wind of God's Spirit blowing new life into our spirits! Now is the time for you to renew your prayers for our staff and members who are carrying out Fairmont's ministry. Now is also the time for all of Fairmont's members to be prayerfully considering how you will financially support the good that is being done in and through our church. ### Monthly Family Worship Sundays 3rd Sundays, during the 10:30 a.m. service

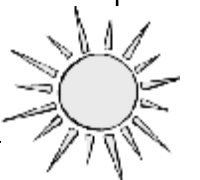

## **MEDICARE CRITICAL--ENROLLMENT AND RE-ENROLLMENT DATES HAVE CHANGED!!!**

Medicare has changed the open enrollment period this year. **The new dates are October 15 to December 7.** This includes those who wish to change their enrollment (for example, Medicare Part D Drug enrollment) or to sign up for the first time. Please note that if you are due to sign up for the first time and miss your enrollment date, you will have a **penalty attached to your premiums for the rest of your life.**

If you do not change your Medicare Part D Drug enrollment before the Dec. 7 deadline, you will not be able to do so for another year. This can make a big difference in your drug costs, especially if your drugs have changed or the drug coverage has changed. It is critical that all seniors are aware of these new dates. ### **October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month!**

#### **American Cancer Society Guidelines for the Early Detection of Breast Cancer**

The American Cancer Society recommends these screening guidelines for most adults.

- Yearly mammograms are recommended starting at age 40 and continuing for as long as a woman is in good health
  - Clinical breast exam (CBE) about every 3 years for women in their 20s and 30s and every year for women 40 and over
- Women should know how their breasts normally look and feel and report any breast change promptly to their health care provider. Breast self-exam (BSE) is an option for women starting in their 20s.



The American Cancer Society recommends that some women -- because of their family history, a

genetic tendency, or certain other factors -- be screened with MRI in addition to mammograms. (The number of women who fall into this category is small: less than 2% of all the women in the US.) Talk with your doctor about your history and whether you should have additional tests at an earlier age.

*An expert's quote:* "A screening test tries to find a disease before there are any symptoms. With breast cancer, there's a misconception that if you feel fine, don't have a lump, and have no family history of breast cancer, you're okay. The truth is that three-quarters of the women in whom we find breast cancer have no risk factors. So screening is important for everyone."

Bill Miller III was hired as the new Information Specialist. This is part-time (15 hours per week). Bill will begin his new position on October 3.

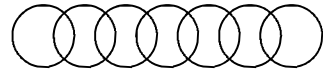
