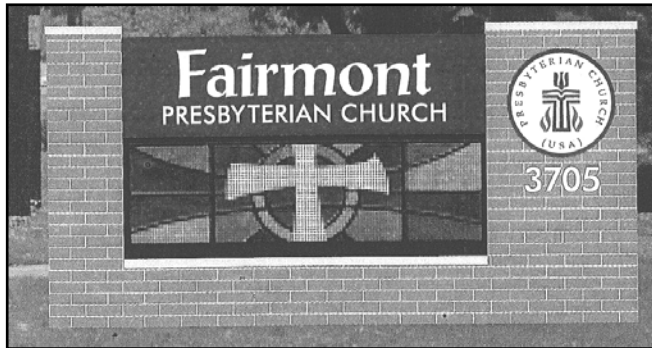
**Electronic Sign Plans Finalized**

Did you know that approximately 40,000 cars a day, every day, drive by Fairmont on Far Hills Avenue? We will soon make our church more visible to those who are driving by and to our community by installing an electronic sign. The sign will enable us to display several scrolling messages, so that we can share all the exciting events that Fairmont has to offer rather than being limited to listing only the week's sermon title or only one event.

The sign will modernize our building, and be easy to program from an office computer. No more struggling to open a glass case to change the message, or being unable to list a special program during the winter months when the glass case was sometimes frozen tight.

Discussion about a sign began a few years ago. Concerns mentioned by members at an information session in 2009 in the Fellowship Hall

were addressed in the final plan. Care will be taken to program the display so that it is easy to read and professional. The display section will rest in a brick base structure designed to complement the traditional style of Fairmont. The sign will offer multi-color options, but we will most often use simply one very visible color for text only.

Session approved the request for the sign from Trustees at the August meeting. Funds for the project are available in the Endowment Income Fund. (Other recent uses of the fund have been for the remodeling of the women's restroom on the ground floor and for the replacement of the front steps, which was necessary to ensure the safety of people entering at the Far Hills sanctuary doors.)

### **Maintaining Fairmont's Membership Rolls**

Section G-10.0302 in our Book of Order requires that "Every session shall maintain rolls of members." Each year, the Clerk of Session, with assistance from the Membership Secretary of Fairmont, provides the Evangelism and Member Care Team with a list of people who have not been active in the church for one year or longer. Those members are sent a letter informing them of their inactive status, and are also sent a questionnaire.

The letter sent to members who have moved from the area encourages them to seek a church home in their new community. The letter sent to those members still in the area welcomes them to return to full, active participation in the life of the church.

Inactive members are informed that if it is their decision to remain inactive, the Presbyterian Book of Order provides that they may stay on the inactive roll for two years. During that time, they may participate in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, present children for Baptism, and receive pastoral care. However, they may not vote at congregational meetings or hold office. After two years of being inactive, they are to be removed from the membership rolls.

The questionnaire enables the member to let us know if they have moved to another church (many churches do not request a letter of transfer, so we may not know of a move). The questionnaire also provides space for the member to inform us of any way Fairmont can be of service to them.

Our hope is that the letters and questionnaires will encourage members to return to Fairmont, or to let us know if they have found another church home. The letters are not meant to be perceived as disciplinary in any way. Keeping accurate membership rolls is a challenge and also necessary as the Session budgets for staffing needs and per capita apportionments.

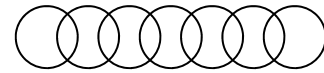

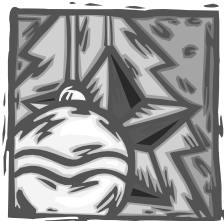
