This year, we are charging \$5 per child. However, scholarships are available for those who would be unable to attend due to the cost. For more information, please contact **Gary Yagley**.

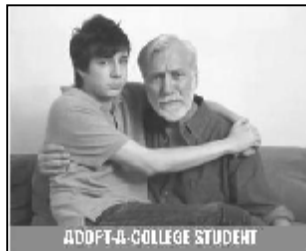

#### Holiday at Home Preparation Underway!

Join us on Monday, September 5, as Fairmont Church supports the community with its Holiday at Home ministry. Last year, we were able to donate nearly 1,600 bottles of water, which translated into Fairmont being able to share its Water Ministry for both days of the event with the Holiday at Home Children's Area, Holiday at Home workers, parade attendees in desperate need of hydration, and, of course, the participants of the 5K run. Once again, we are asking for donations to help us with our ever-expanding Water Ministry, as well as our parade day Comfort/Changing Station and Concession Stand.



Here's how you can help:

\* **Bring in cases of bottled water.** We need the 16.9 ounce sized bottles (the ones with a straight, flat surface to hold a label of approximately 2 to

2-1/2 inches wide). We also found that “house brand” water bottles (like those from CVS for example) are a perfect match for our needs.

\* **Review the list of items needed** that has been placed at both the Welcome Desk and the Monitor’s Station, then sign-up to donate something.

\* **Make a contribution** to help fund this event either through the mail or during the offering collection at any praise and worship service. \* **Volunteer in early August to place Fairmont labels on the water bottles for the Water Bottle Ministry.**

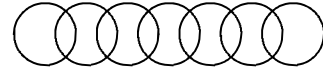

### Financial Update

The Fairmont Board of Trustees thought it would be helpful to issue quarterly financial updates. The congregation will be kept informed about the giving and expenses and will have a continuing picture of the financial health of Fairmont.

**2011 First Quarter** - Through the end of March:

Total income was	\$150,721
Total expense was	<u>150,677</u>
Excess	\$ 44

The first installment of Fairmont's mission giving was paid in March. All staff and program expenses are in line with budget.

With expenses equaling income, you can see how important it is to pay your pledge in a timely manner. The process for making contributions online through the church website, called the Vanco process, is convenient but costs the church over \$50 a month. One can achieve the same objective by setting up an online monthly payment from your checking account which does not cost either party anything. It is something to consider.

Spring is in the Air - Time to Build Another House

First of all, many thanks to all Fairmont volunteers for their stewardship of time and financial support

building Habitat for Humanity homes during the past 18 years.

This will be the 19<sup>th</sup> year Fairmont has combined with other churches in the Dayton area to construct a home, this time for Carmen Baccus and her three children, Derrick, Antina'e and Darmis. The house will be down the street from last year's build at 4763 Stratsburg Dr. near the VA Hospital off of Liscum Dr. in West Dayton. It will be a four-bedroom ranch.

We need folks to work in all phases of this project – layout, construction and hospitality tent. We start framing the house “Blitz Week” building every day starting on Saturday May 28 of Memorial Day Weekend through Friday June 3, then followed by working Tuesday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. until the house is completed. There will be a crew on Tuesday evenings for those that are not available during the day.

### **An Announcement from Presbytery of the Miami Valley**

My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

We are writing to you in response to the ratification of Amendment 10-A by a majority of the

presbyteries of the PCUSA. As we are sure you know, this change to our denominational constitution replaces language describing the qualifications for office in the PCUSA as follows: [Text to be deleted is shown in light gray text; text to be added is shown as *italic*.]

"b. Those who are called to office in the church are to lead a life in obedience to Scripture and in conformity to the historic confessional standards of the church. Among these standards is the requirement to live either in fidelity within the covenant of marriage between a man and a woman (W-4.9001), or chastity in singleness. Persons refusing to repent of any self-acknowledged practice which the confessions call sin shall not be ordained and/or installed as deacons, elders, or ministers of the Word and Sacrament. *Standards for ordained service reflect the church's desire to submit joyfully to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life (G-1.0000). The governing body responsible for ordination and/or installation (G.14.0240; G-14.0450) shall examine each candidate's calling, gifts, preparation, and suitability for the responsibilities of office. The examination shall include, but not be limited to, a determination of the candidate's ability and commitment to fulfill all requirements as expressed in the constitutional questions for ordination and installation (W-4.4003). Governing bodies shall be guided by Scripture and the confessions in applying standards to individual candidates.*"

Many among you are likely celebrating the passage of this amendment while at the same time others are grieving its passage. The secular press, as well as denominational affinity groups on both sides of the issue, are likely to misrepresent the potential consequences of this vote. Let us share several observations with you.

§ The vote **does** remove explicit language barring those involved in sexual relationships outside the bonds of marriage between a man and a woman from holding office in the church.

§ The new language **does** more clearly place the responsibility for determining a candidate's fitness for office on the governing body calling the individual to service.

§ The new provision **does not** force any congregation, session or presbytery to ordain or

install to service any person that it does not deem qualified.

We urge you to exercise restraint in your reactions to this development. We, in the Presbytery of the Miami Valley, have made considerable strides in bridging our theological differences and we hope and pray that this change will not trigger a new sense of fear and distrust among us. Friends, we "beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, **making every effort** to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all" (Eph 4:1b-6).
